

LEADER Bible Study

After King Solomon died, the tribes of Israel split into two kingdoms the Northern Kingdom of Israel and the Southern Kingdom of Judah. Jeroboam was the king of Israel, and Solomon's son Rehoboam was the king of Judah. These two kingdoms were frequently at war with each other, and they rotated through mostly evil kings for decades. Ahab was the king of Israel when the prophet Elijah came to him.

The name *Elijah* means "My God is Yahweh." We don't know anything about Elijah's background or family, but God chose Elijah (and later the prophet Elisha) to warn the Israelites of their future destruction. For years, God sent prophets to warn His people about the consequences their sin would bring. He wanted them to turn back to Him, but they would not.

Three significant events occur in 1 Kings 17. First, Elijah announced a drought in the land of Israel. Evil King Ahab and his wife Jezebel encouraged Baal worship, so the drought was punishment for Israel's idolatry—according to the law of God. (Deut. 11:16-17) God provided for Elijah during the drought.

Second, Elijah visited a widow. God promised that the widow would provide for him. Lack of rain caused a famine in the land. God provided food for the widow and her son. Elijah stayed with the widow for two years.

Third, Elijah raised the widow's son from the dead. Elijah asked God to bring the boy back to life, and God did. The woman believed that Elijah was a man of God and that his words from God were true.

Help kids connect this story to Jesus. God miraculously provided through Elijah to give food to the widow and life to the widow's son. Many years later, God miraculously provided through His own Son, Jesus. Jesus is greater than Elijah. In Jesus, God provides salvation and life to everyone who trusts in Him.

The **BIBLE** Story

Elijah and the Widow 1 Kings 17

Elijah the prophet spoke to Ahab, the evil king of Israel, and gave him a message: "There will be no dew or rain for the next few years unless I command it. This will certainly happen."

> Then God told Elijah to go to a place near a stream. God said the ravens would provide food for Elijah to eat. So Elijah obeyed God. The ravens brought him bread and meat, and he drank water from the stream. After a while, the stream dried up because there was no rain in the land.

Then God told Elijah to go to a small village. God said a widow in the town would provide for Elijah. So Elijah obeyed God. When Elijah got to the gate of the city, he saw a widow gathering wood. He called to her, "Please bring me a little water so I can drink." As she went to get it, he added, "Please bring me a piece of bread too."

But the woman told Elijah, "I don't have bread. I only have a little bit of flour and oil." The woman and her son were planning to eat one more meal before they died from hunger.

"Don't be afraid," Elijah said. "Go and prepare the meal, but first bring me a small loaf of bread. Then make some for yourself and your

son. God says you will not run out of flour or oil until rain comes again."

So the woman prepared the meal. She, Elijah, and everyone in her household had enough to eat, and she did not run out of flour or oil just like the Lord had said.

Some time later, the woman's son got sick and he stopped breathing. Elijah took the boy upstairs and laid him on the bed. He cried out to God, stretched himself out over the boy three times, and cried out to God again. "Lord my God, please let this boy live again!" Elijah prayed.

The Lord listened to Elijah, and the boy's life came into him again. He was alive! Elijah led the boy to his mother. She said to Elijah, "Now I know you are a man of God, and the Lord really does speak through you."

INTRODUCE the Story



SESSION TITLE: Elijah and the Widow **C BIBLE PASSAGE:** 1 Kings 17 **STORY POINT:** God provided in miraculous ways.

KEY PASSAGE: Isaiah 42:8

BIG PICTURE QUESTION: How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.

Intro Music

Note: Be sensitive to any kids who may struggle with food insecurity.

Note: These optional activities are a way for you to connect with kids before worship.

• Paper plates • crayons, markers, or colored pencils Welcome time

Play intro music and greet each kid as he or she arrives. Help new kids connect to your group. Prompt kids to talk about a time they were very hungry. What did they eat? SAY • It is a sad truth that, even in some developed countries, many people go hungry sometimes. Christians can work together to meet the needs of those who are hungry. Today we will learn about a time a prophet of God helped a woman and her son when they were very, very hungry.

Optional Activity: Last meal

Provide each kid with a paper plate. Let the kids share markers, crayons, or colored pencils. Invite the kids to draw on their plates what they would want to eat if it were to be their last meal for a while.

SAY • During a drought, there isn't enough rain to grow the crops needed to feed everyone. As a result, some people may go hungry. If you knew you would not eat again for a long time, what would you choose to eat as your last meal? Today we will learn that

a woman and her son got more food than they expected! How do you think they got all their extra food?

Transition to teach the story

Video: Countdown

2 pie pans, 20 m&m's, dairy free whipped cream, table

Countdown

Show the countdown video as you transition to the Large Group Game . LEADER • Hey everyone! Let's play a fun game. For this game, I need 2 volunteers that aren't afraid of getting a little messy.

Choose 2 kids. Try to choose kids that haven't been chosen before. Bring them up on stage and give each of them a plastic poncho to put over their clothes. OK, have you guys ever heard of the game Pie Face? Of course you have! It's a super popular game where you could get slapped in the face with that plastic hand filled with whipped cream. Well, we are going to play our own version of pie face right here right now! But don't worry you won't be slapped in the face today.

Show table with aluminum pie tins and have the 2 kids stand behind their pie tin. Take a look inside your pie tin and you will see 10 m&m's. What you have to do after I say "GO" is using only your mouth - not your hands at all - get out as many m&m's as possible. Whoever gets out the most m&m's before the buzzer sounds is the winner! Oh, and don't eat the m&m's! We have to be able to count them afterwards.

Ok ready?! 3-2-1...WAIT! I almost forgot. Silly me. We can't play Pie Face without a little whipped cream! Pull out non-dairy whipped cream canister and hold it up. And by little, I mean a lot! [*To contestants*] And don't worry kids, this is Non-Dairy whipped cream...so it's safe if you have a dairy allergy. Ok, let's cover up those m&m's!

Spray enough whipped cream into each pie tin so that every m&m is completely covered.

OK, now we are ready! 3-2-1 GO!

Worship

LEADER • In today's story, God provided in miraculous ways. Everything we have comes from God—from riches and honor to greatness and strength. Let's give Him thanks and praise His glorious name.

Kids Leader Guide Unit 13 • Session 1

SFX: Game

Music

Introduce the session (3 minutes)

Leader enters wearing business casual attire. Leader is carrying a Bible and pointer stick, and he or she is very excited to see the kids.

LEADER •Greetings, everyone! How is the weather down there? [*Laugh at the joke.*] That's one of my favorite meteorology jokes; you see, I'm up here and you're down there. Ha, it makes me laugh every time! But I'm not here just to laugh, though I do love laughing.

Thank you for inviting me to be your guest over the next few weeks to share my love of meteorology and the weather with you. When you think about it, knowing the weather impacts so much of our day: what we can and cannot do, what we should wear, where we should go, and so much more. In my line of work, we try hard to forecast the weather accurately, but sometimes it's simply unpredictable!

Atmospheric conditions are always changing. That's one reason I really treasure God's Word—it never changes! I want to share a Bible story with you today. It actually includes a detail about a weather phenomenon called a drought, or period of unusually low rainfall. Let's see what was going on.

Big picture question (1 minute)

LEADER • Before we get into our story, we need to set up our big picture question. This question will help us focus on a specific lesson we can learn from the Bible stories we will study over the next few weeks. **How many gods are there?**

As we learn our different stories, we'll talk through the answer and explain how we know it's the correct one.

Giant timeline (1 minute)

Show the giant timeline. Point to individual Bible stories as you review. **LEADER** •When we read the Bible, we need to know about the things that happened before the story to understand why things are happening in the story. Let's take a look at our timeline. God's people, Israel, were divided into two kingdoms because they did not obey God's commands. Today's story is about Elijah, a prophet of God to the Northern Kingdom of Israel. God had a message for Elijah to share with the king.

Watch the Bible story

Show the Bible story video "Elijah and the Widow" LEADER • God always does the most amazing things! Can you imagine having a flock of birds bringing your food every day? That's so cool.

But when the stream dried up, God sent Elijah on his way. The widow and her son were expecting to eat one last meal before they died, but God had a different idea.

God wanted them to help Elijah and trust that He would provide, and He did. Again and again they used oil and flour. Instead of enough for one small last meal, they had enough to last them the rest of the drought and famine!

Some time later, God allowed Elijah to do more than just keep them alive with miraculous food. God gave Elijah the miraculous power to bring the son back to life! God provided in miraculous ways. These miracles are things that only God can do. People worship many false gods, but only the one true God can prove His power in such ways. That's the answer to our big picture question!

CG: Big Picture Question

How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.

The one true God is a miraculous provider who loves His people. When the Israelites were slaves in Egypt, God provided freedom. In the wilderness before entering the promised land, God provided food and water. When Israel was in the promised land but kept disobeying God, He provided judges to lead them back to Him. Again and again, God proved that He is faithful to provide. But the greatest provision of God was still to come.

Christ connection

LEADER • Elijah believed God's words and obeyed. Elijah's miracles proved that he was a prophet of the one true God. Jesus, however, is even greater than Elijah. Jesus' miracles proved that He is God the Son. All of God's promises come true in Jesus. We can trust that Jesus loves us and has a plan to use our lives to point other people to Him so they can know His love too.

CG: Key

Passage Key passage (1 minute)

Show the key passage slide. Lead the kids to read Isaiah 42:8. Encourage the girls to read it aloud together. Then instruct the boys read it aloud. Lead everyone to read it together one more time.

LEADER • Though you may not realize it at first, our key passage reminds us how much God loves us. He knows that idols aren't real and can't do anything for us. He wants us to praise Him alone because only He loves us perfectly and provides everything we need.

Pray and dismiss to Small Groups

APPLY the Story



Small Group

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KEY PASSAGE: Isaiah 42:8

BIG PICTURE QUESTION: How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.

Key passage activity

•Key Passage Poster •"Key Passage Words" Printable •Tape, 1 per group

Hand each kid one (or more if you have a smaller group) key passage words. Instruct the kids to arrange themselves in the right order sitting in a line. Read the verse together, inviting each kid to raise their paper when his or her word is spoken. Mix up the papers and play again. **SAY** • Great job with the key passage! Our verse teaches us that God that God does not allow anyone or anything to take away from His glory. *How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship*. We worship all kinds of things and may not realize it. Worshiping something means to give it most of our time, thoughts, and praise. What are some things we make more important than God and why?

Wants and needs

Instruct the kids to stand in a circle. Say the names of different objects that kids might want or need. Instruct the kids to pat their heads if the item is a want and rub their bellies if it's a need. Some items may be both a want and a need. Allow kids to explain their reasoning.

Suggested items: TV, food, oxygen, love, video games, Jesus SAY • In our story today, the widow and her son did not have the food they needed. *God provided in miraculous ways.* God provides for all of us because He loves us. Jesus provides salvation for us in a miraculous way. Jesus died on the cross to pay

salvation for us in a miraculous way. Jesus died on the cross to pay for our sins and rose again on the third day. The Bible tells us that in addition to needing Jesus, we can find joy in Him. That means that Jesus is more than our greatest need, He's our greatest "want" too! If time remains, take prayer requests or allow kids to complete the Bible story coloring page provided with this session. Pray for your group.

Send home the "What Do You Need?" Activity Page
