God forgives our sin by what Jesus did



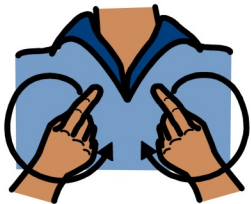
on the cross. Jesus died on the cross



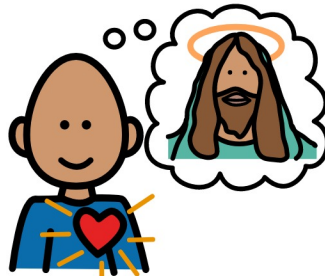
and rose from the grave to



to pay the penalty



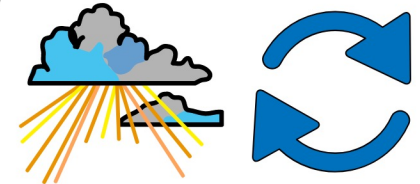
for our sins and fix what has been broken.
