A flight attendant who is struck on the head during a plane crash and left with amnesia whose father owned a pet store.


Asaxophone-playing jazz singer gets struck by lightning on a cable car, giving him superpowers, but making it difficult for him to sleep.


• What is Romans 3:21-23 saying?
