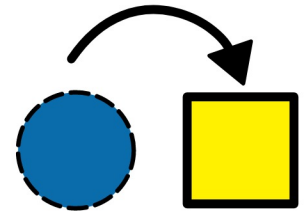
How can we look out for one another?



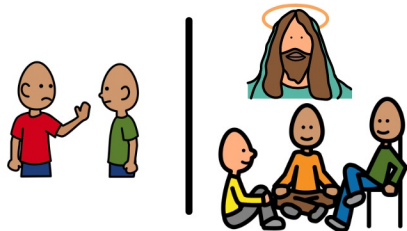
In Luke, we read about the amazing things Jesus did and the way crowds of people started to follow Him everywhere.

Jesus also spent time with people the religious leaders avoided.



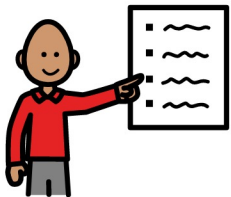
Jesus cared more about people's needs than about keeping up with appearances.



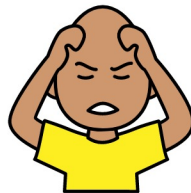
Jesus allowed his disciples to eat and pick grain on the Sabbath, a day of rest.



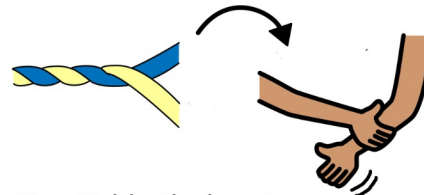
The religious leaders were talking about the special laws that God had given the Israelites when Moses lead them out of Egypt.



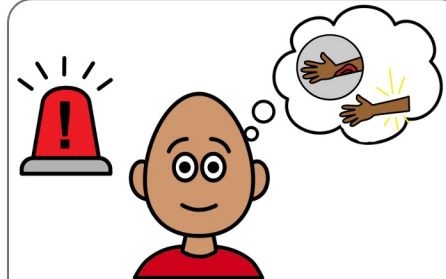
The religious leaders began to put more rules on the Sabbath. Those extra rules were not from God.



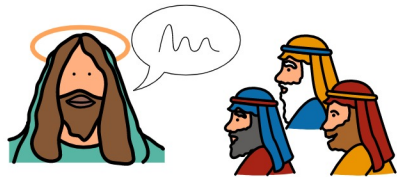
Instead of making the Sabbath more restful, it made it more stressful for most people.



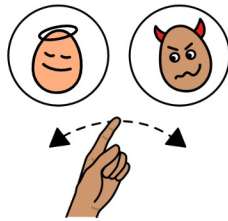
One Sabbath day, Jesus entered his synagogue and began to preach. In the crowd sat a man with a weak, twisted hand.



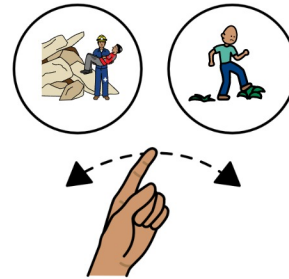
Right away, the religious leaders went on high alert.



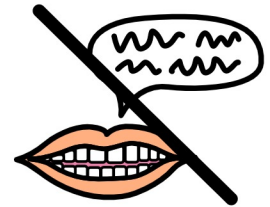
Jesus knew right away what the religious leaders were thinking. Jesus confronted the religious leaders.



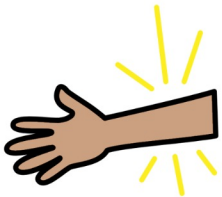
Jesus said: "What does the law say we should do on the Sabbath? Should we do good or should we do evil?"

No one answered.



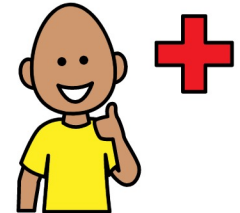
Jesus spoke to the man with the twisted hand and told him to stretch out his hand. The man reached out and his hand became as good as new.



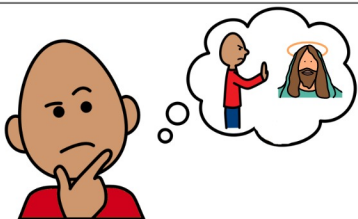
The religious leaders did not celebrate along with everyone. They got very angry.



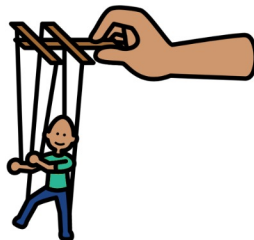
Jesus had not broken God's law about the Sabbath, but He chose to ignore the extra rules made by the religious leaders



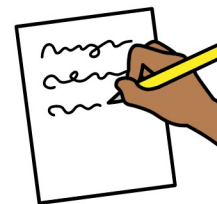
in order to care for a man that was hurting and to make him well.



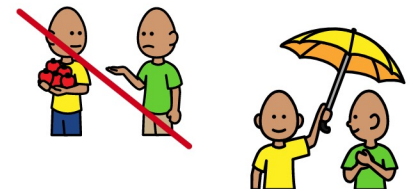
The religious leaders cared more about rules than about helping people, so they started plotting how to stop Jesus.
