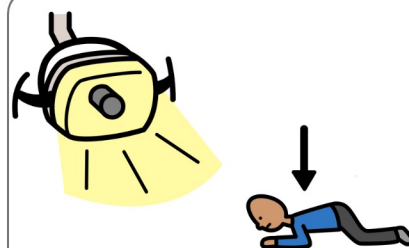
How can we live in peace with one another?



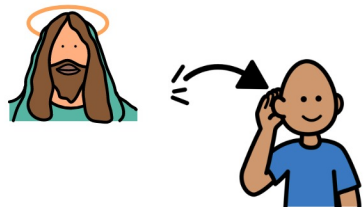
Saul was a Pharisee, one of the Jewish religious leaders. He believed that Jesus' followers were going against God's law.



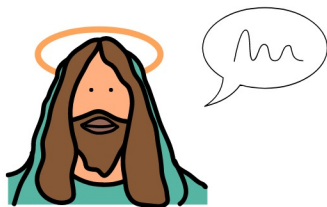
He set off for Damascus to get rid of the believers there.



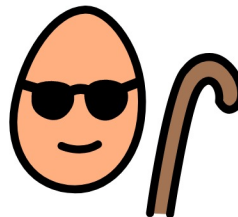
As he neared Damascus, Saul saw a blinding light. He dropped to the ground

Jesus said to Saul, "Get up and go into the city. There you will be told what you must do."



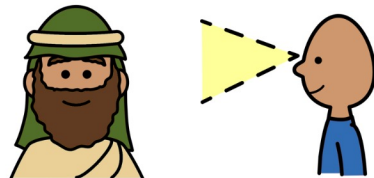
Saul obeyed even though he was now blind.



Meanwhile, God spoke to a believer named Ananias with instructions to go find Paul and place his hands on him to heal him of blindness.



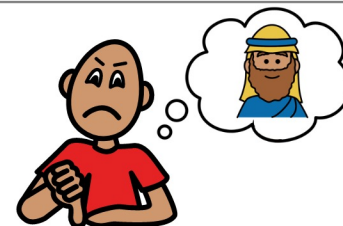
Ananias knew Saul was there to arrest believers, but God made it clear.



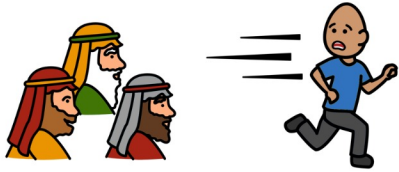
Ananias went in peace to his enemy and Saul's sight returned.



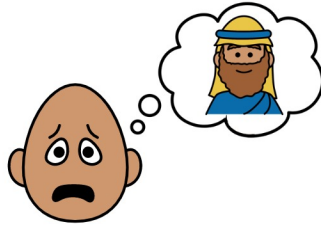
Saul immediately started preaching about Jesus, which put him in a tricky position.



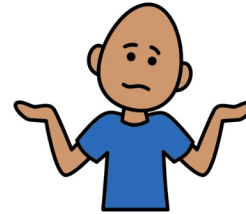
In one hand, Jewish leaders hated Jesus' followers, so now they didn't like Saul.



In fact, while Saul was in Damascus, the Jewish religious leaders tried to kill him. Saul escaped.



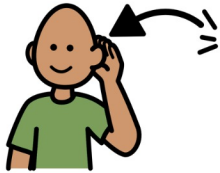
And in the other hand, when Saul traveled to Jerusalem, the Jesus followers there were still afraid of him.



How was he going to get anyone to accept him?



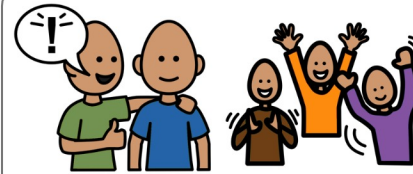
Barnabas! Barnabas was a believer known for encouraging others.

With Barnabas' encouragement, the believers in Jerusalem finally accepted Saul as one of their own.



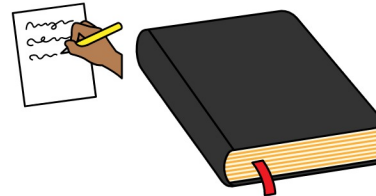
It wasn't long until the Jewish religious leaders in Jerusalem also tried to kill Saul. His friends took him to safety.



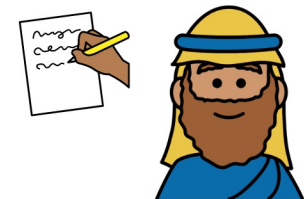
Saul, also known as Paul, traveled all over - Turkey, Greece, Cyprus, Italy, Syria, and Israel
