Origin Story — When Our Story with God Begins

DAY 1

Read Psalm 19:1.

"The heavens tell about the glory of God. The skies show that his hands created them" (NIrV).

The heavens TELL.

The skies SHOW.

They're all made by GOD'S HANDS.

You can just walk outside and see and know that God is real. Look up. Look around you. What do you see that God made? Everything.

Wait a minute? I thought some factory made my video game? Yeah, they did. But God made all the resources that are used to create and build that game, that game system, and even the creativity of the people—who God also created.

Colossians 1:17 says that before anything was created, God was already there. He holds everything together. Everything points back to Him.

So as you go through each day, look for things God created. It may just remind you of how much He loves you and how awesome He is!

DAY 2

Read Psalm 119:68.

"You are good, and what you do is good. Teach me your orders" (NIrV).

God is good. Sure, lots of things are good. Ice cream is good. Having fun with your friends is good. But God IS good. It's who He is. He can't be any different. No matter what, God is good.

The writer of Psalm 119 said that God is good, and what He does is good.

But the writer still said that God is good. God is still good even when we don't understand why certain things happen. And when amazing things happen, God is still good.

Nahum 1:7 says the Lord is good. When people are in trouble, they can go to Him for safety. You can know without a doubt that God is always good. He doesn't change.

DAY 3

Read Hebrews 4:16.

"So let us boldly approach God's throne of grace. Then we will receive mercy. We will find grace to help us when we need it" (NIrV).

When Adam and Eve sinned, a whole bunch of really sad stuff happened. Sin didn't just hurt their hearts—it also hurt the world! The curse of sin brought pain, sickness, sadness, and even death. That was never God's plan.

God had tried to protect Adam and Eve from all of this, but now He told them how much harder their lives would be. Even though God still loved them, He knew they couldn't stay in the garden any longer. He made them clothes to wear from animal skins, then banished them from the garden.

He didn't want to risk them coming into the garden, eating from the tree of life, and living forever in their cursed state. God didn't want them to live forever apart from Him. The Bible says He placed angels and a flaming sword at the entrance to guard the way to the tree of life.

WE AREN'T PERFECT

When you sin, go to God and tell Him about it. He already knows and still loves you, but God also knows that it does something good for your heart when you talk to Him about it. He can and wants to forgive you!

DAY 4

Read Romans 5:8.

"But here is how God has shown his love for us. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (NIrV).

Yesterday, we read how sin entered the world. We have all sinned! Sin is anything that displeases God and hurts his heart.

No one is perfect, and we all mess up. Even the people you think do everything right don't do everything right all the time.

Here's the amazing thing. God showed His love for us. While we were still sinners Jesus died for us. Not when we were perfect, Jesus loves us so much!

He wants us to come to Him when we're making good choices. And He wants us to come to Him when we make choices that aren't so good.

As you pray today, thank Jesus for loving you no matter what.

You can trust God even when you don't understand.

DAY 1

Read Hebrews 11:7

"Noah had faith. So he built an ark to save his family. He built it because of his great respect for God. God had warned him about things that could not yet be seen. Because of his faith Noah showed the world that it was guilty. Because of his faith he was considered right with God" (NIrV).

Have you ever thought about what it's like to be an actor in a movie or TV show?

They have to read the script, memorize it, and then act it out on a set. Nothing is really complete yet; they are doing their part. And then, a long time later, they see the finished product.

Sometimes, like in big superhero movies, they are talking to things that aren't even there. But once the computer graphics have been added, it's a whole different scene in the final movie.

The actor did something that wasn't fully seen yet. It is a lot like faith, acting on something that might not be seen.

DAY 2

Read Genesis 6:22.

"Noah did everything just as God commanded him" (NIrV).

Let's break this down...Noah had a HUGE task ahead of him. I mean, this was a big deal. Building one, very big ark (a big huge boat)!

At some point, he had to pick up the hammer and start working. At some point, he had to pick up the first piece of wood and, you guessed it, start working!

Have you ever had a school project or a big chore to do? I'm sure it probably took a while, but at some point, you finished it. The first step was just starting, then doing the hard work to get it done.

Noah did everything just as God commanded him. This is something we should go after! If you know you are supposed to do something, are you doing everything you need to do?

FINISH THE PROJECT

Go get some Lego®s or some paper, tape, and scissors. Make a big boat! And make sure you finish it; you could even write on a sticky note and put it on the fridge, "By this date, (fill in date) I'm going to finish making the boat." Let it be a reminder that we can work hard and finish what we start!

Read Genesis 6:9.

"Noah was a godly man. He was without blame among the people of his time. He walked faithfully with God" (NIrV).

Noah seemed to be very focused on following what God asked him to do. Here's the thing: Noah didn't have a huge crowd cheering him on... There wasn't this massive group of people telling Noah, "Go, Noah! You got this! Keep going!"

In fact, Noah had the opposite. People made fun of him for doing what God asked him to do.

He chose to keep going without tons of support, but he had God's support. He walked faithfully with God. Even when other people aren't supporting you, God is.

DAY 1

Read Jeremiah 29:11.

"I know the plans I have for you," announces the LORD. "I want you to enjoy success. I do not plan to harm you. I will give you hope for the years to come" (NIrV).

Read Hebrews 12:1-2.

"A huge cloud of witnesses is all around us. So let us throw off everything that stands in our way. Let us throw off any sin that holds on to us so tightly. And let us keep on running the race marked out for us. Let us keep looking to Jesus. He is the one who started this journey of faith. And he is the one who completes the journey of faith. He paid no attention to the shame of the cross. He suffered there because of the joy he was looking forward to. Then he sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (NIrV).

Have you ever heard this phrase, "Just keep swimming"? It's about not giving up.

There will be times when you might start getting distracted, hurt, or lose energy to just keep swimming. But Jesus can help you keep going!

Sometimes, when we get a little weary or tired, it helps to remember what we are called to do and just keep swimming.

If you keep your attention on Jesus, He's the one who will help you keep swimming! Sometimes, we want to quit what we are doing. Look to Jesus; He will help you keep swimming. When our eyes are on Jesus, our attention isn't on the worry or problem; our eyes are on Him!

By doing this, we keep swimming.

DAY 1

Read John 10:27.

"My sheep listen to my voice. I know them, and they follow me" (NIrV).

In the Bible, people are often described as sheep. Sheep need a shepherd to know where to go. They listen to the shepherd's voice and follow him.

Jesus described Himself as our good Shepherd. We just have to listen to His voice.

How do we do that?

He speaks to us through the Bible.

He speaks to us through the Holy Spirit He has put in us when we are saved.

DAY 2

DAY 4

Read Psalm 5:3.

"Lord, in the morning you hear my voice. In the morning I pray to you. I wait for you in hope" (NIrV).

When you watch movies or shows, is there always drama and action the whole time? Most likely not. Even in an action movie, it still gets a little quiet at times, or the story gets a little slow.

What about music? Is a song really loud the whole time? Most likely not. Typically, it might get loud, then a little softer, and then loud again.

Even in life, we might have a lot happen, and then a pause...and then something else happens!!! And then a pause...

How do you handle the pauses? Joseph had a huge pause. He was in prison for something that he didn't even do! But he had to wait and trust God. Eventually, more action came!

A verse in the book of Psalms says: "I wait for you in hope." We aren't supposed to sit around and do nothing, even in the waiting. We wait in hope.

Look at this squiggly line—it has ups and downs, just like life. There's action and there are pauses. But in the middle of it all, God is still working.

Now, here's something fun: each time the line dips downward, write a letter. On the first dip, write 'H'. On the second, write 'O'. On the third, write 'P', and on the fourth, write 'E'.

What does that spell? HOPE!

Read Genesis 39:20-21.

"So he put Joseph in prison. It was the place where the king's prisoners were kept. While Joseph was there in the prison, the Lord was with him. He was kind to him. So the man running the prison was pleased with Joseph" (NIrV).

Here's an activity for you to do. Grab a clear jar or plastic cup and then cut up some pieces of paper.

Now write or draw hard things you might go through, like sadness, sickness, loneliness, being afraid, on each piece of paper.

Place them inside the jar one at a time, saying, "Even in _____, God is with me."

Once the jar is full, write "God is with me" on one more piece of paper and tape it to the outside of the jar.

Whenever you have a worry or difficult emotion, write it down and put it in the jar.
