One family saved their son's life by hiding him in a basket at the river's edge. The boy, later called Moses, was discovered by the Egyptian Princess and raised as her own.



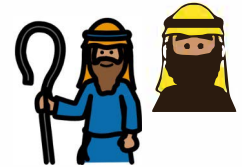
When Moses was older, he made some trouble while trying to help the Israelites. He ran away to Midian.



One day, God called to Moses from the midst of a burning bush. God had heard the cry of the Israelites and He wanted Moses to lead the rescue mission.



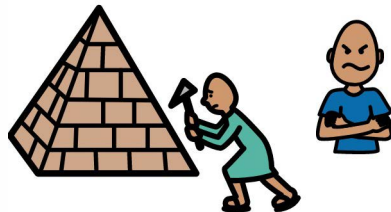
God promised to bring the Israelites out of Egypt and to a land with plenty of milk and honey.



Moses was filled with fear. God sent his brother Aaron to help Moses speak. Moses still didn't feel ready, but He knew that God was with him.



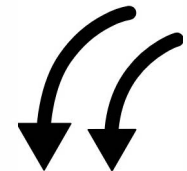
After speaking to the Israelite Elders, Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh and asked him to let God's people go.



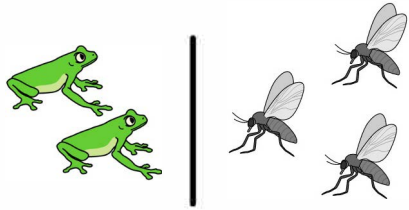
Not only did Pharaoh refuse to let the Israelites go, he made them work even harder. Now the Israelites were mad at Moses too.



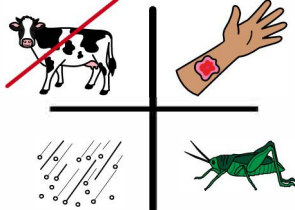
Moses showed Pharaoh amazing signs, but still Pharaoh said "no". God turned the waters into blood, but Pharaoh refused to believe.



Again and again, God instructed Moses to tell Pharaoh to let His people go. Over and over, Pharaoh refused.



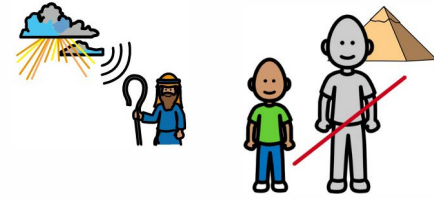
God sent frogs, then clouds of gnats and flies.



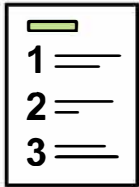
Livestock died and Egyptians were covered in terrible sores. Huge hail storms rained down, locust destroyed anything that was left.



Deep darkness covered the land for 3 days, through all of this Pharaoh still refused to let God's people go.



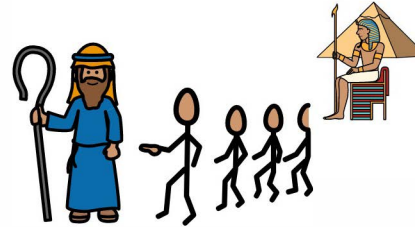
God warned Moses of one final terrible plague. At midnight, the first born son of every Egyptian family would die.



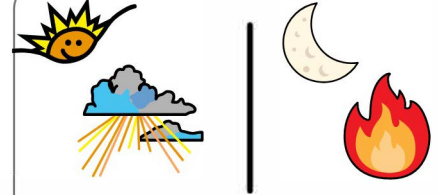
God gave Moses special instructions for the Israelites.



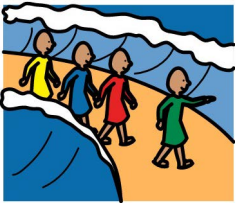
"Each family must kill a passover lamb. Put some of the blood over the top of your doorframe and along both sides, then the destroying angel will pass by your homes", God said.

As the Israelites reached the other side, the waters closed up and the Egyptian army was swept up by the sea.

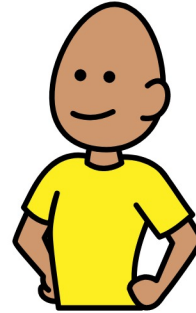


Moses chose to trust. God gave him the courage to lead His people to freedom.

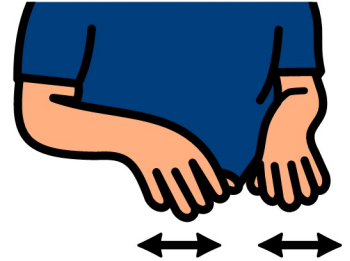
