Lesson Outline - God is Holy.

BIG IDEA

God is Holy, which means He is set apart, and He has called us to be set apart too.

BIBLE

Isaiah 6:1-8; 1 Peter 1:15-16

ABOUT THIS WEEK

In this series, we'll discover who God really is by looking at His character. Each week we'll see that God is holy, loving, just, and faithful—and how those truths change the way we live. When we know God for who He is, it transforms how we see ourselves, how we treat others, and how we walk with Him every day. This series is about moving from just knowing about God to truly knowing Him.

God is *holy*—that means He's completely perfect, pure, and unlike anyone or anything else. In Isaiah 6, Isaiah sees God on His throne, surrounded by angels shouting, "Holy, holy, holy!" When Isaiah saw God's holiness, he realized how small and imperfect he was. But instead of pushing Isaiah away, God forgave him and gave him a purpose.

Key Point:

God's holiness shows us who He really is—set apart, powerful, and perfect in every way.

God's holiness isn't just about Him—it's about how we live because we belong to Him. When we follow Jesus, God calls us to live set apart too. That doesn't mean being weird or acting "better than" people—it means living in a way that reflects who God is.

Tension to Explore:

It's hard to live set apart when everyone else seems to do whatever they want. Sometimes it feels easier to blend in, laugh at the same jokes, talk the same way, or go along with the crowd. But when we remember that God has made us His own, we realize holiness isn't about rules—it's about relationship.

Gospel Hope:

We don't become holy by trying harder—we become holy because Jesus made us new. Just like Isaiah was forgiven, we're made clean through Jesus so we can live differently.

If God is holy and He's called you to be set apart, what does that look like this week? Challenge Students To Think:

- What's one place where you've been blending in instead of standing out for God?
- What's one way you can live "set apart" this week—at school, online, or at home?
