THIS WEEK

BIG IDEA

God is Holy, which means He is set apart, and He has called us to be set apart too.

BIBLE

Isaiah 6:1-8; 1 Peter 1:15-16

ABOUT THIS WEEK

God is completely set apart-perfect, pure, and unlike anything else. When Isaiah encountered God's holiness, it exposed his own sin and his need for grace. But instead of rejecting him, God forgave and restored him. Through Jesus, we can stand forgiven and invited to live differently because of who God is.

Let's Break the Ice:

- What's one thing you've seen that left you in complete awe—something pictures or words couldn't fully capture?
- When's the last time you were reminded that God is bigger, greater, or more powerful than you realized?

Bible Study + Discussion Questions:

Read Isaiah 6:1-8 and 1 Peter 1:15-16 together.

- How would you describe Isaiah's reaction when he sees God's holiness? Why do you think he responded that way?
- What does this story show us about how God views sin and purity?
- God's holiness reveals both His perfection and our sin. Why is that both uncomfortable and good news?
- How does Jesus make it possible for us to come close to a holy God?
 - o How does this remind us of our true dependence on Jesus?
- Why do you think God calls His people to live holy lives if He already knows we'll never be perfect?
- What does it look like to live "set apart" in a world where most people just want to fit in?

Make it Real:

 How can you reflect God's faithfulness in your relationships this week—by keeping your word, showing up, or staying dependable even when it's hard

Discipleship Moment:

Prayer for Holiness: This week, start each morning with this short prayer:

"God, You're holy—and I want to live like You today."

Then, be intentional to live differently in one specific area—like how you talk, treat others, or handle temptation.

Partner Check-In: Pair students up and have them commit to checking in with their partner either sometime during the week or during your next gathering.

• Ask for any prayer requests or praises to celebrate together.

Group Prayer:

- Encourage students to pray briefly for each other's requests.
- Close by reflecting on God's holiness.
