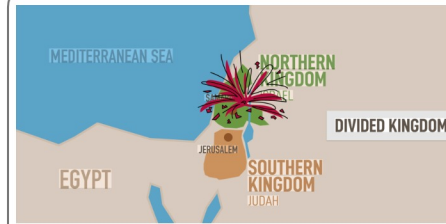
God had promised to bless the whole world through Abraham's family, but God's people didn't often live up to this calling.



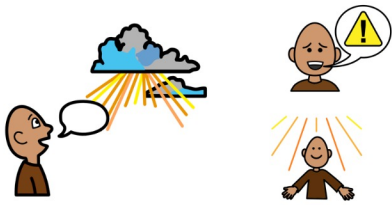
So, God sent prophets to speak truth to the people and their leaders.



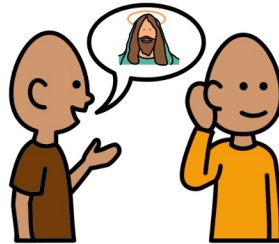
They warned that if God's people refused to turn back to God, there would be difficult consequences.

In the middle of all the panic and fear, God sent the prophet Isaiah. He brought warning and words of hope.



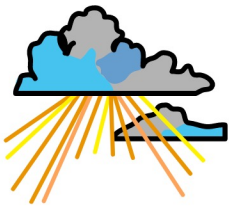
Isaiah went on to explain what the light would be, who that light would be.

"Wonderful Advisor" - means this coming King will be an advisor to help people know what to do.



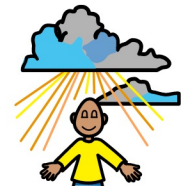
"Mighty God" - means this ruler won't just be a King. He will actually be God with all the mighty and strength.



"Father who lives forever" - this ruler will be like the best dad forever.



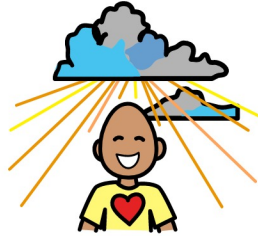
"Prince who brings peace" - He will bring true peace between us and God.



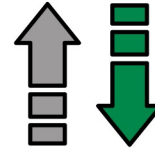
There will be no limit to how great His authority is, the peace He brings will never end. He will rule on David's throne and over His kingdom.

Micah prophesied about hard times to come, but he too shared God's word of hope.



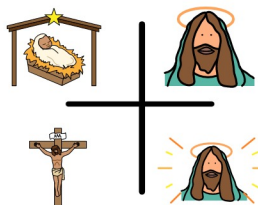
Soon after Isaiah and Micah, enemies attacked Judah and many of God's people were taken in as captives to foreign lands. After time, some returned home.
