Jesus had entered Jerusalem to cheers of crowds. But through the following week, the religious leaders confronted Jesus again and again.




Judas (a close friend of Jesus) made a plan to hand Jesus over to the religious leaders.

Jesus knew all of this when he shared the Passover meal with his friends Thursday evening. Jesus washed their feet and promised that He was going away, but would make a special place for them with God.




Peter told Jesus that He would follow Him anywhere. Jesus replied, "Before the rooster crows you will say 3 times that you do not know me".

They tied Jesus up and took Him to Annas, the father-in-law of the High Priest. The religious leaders didn't have any evidence against Jesus so they resorted to lies.




Peter was scared he might be taken too. Just as Jesus said, Peter denied he was a friend of Jesus three times. Then the rooster crows.

Jesus was nailed to a cross there, between two criminals.




Jesus saw His mother standing nearby and asked His friend John to take care of her.




At last, Jesus cried out: "It is finished!". Then, He bowed His head and He died.


Jesus' friends were devastated and confused.




